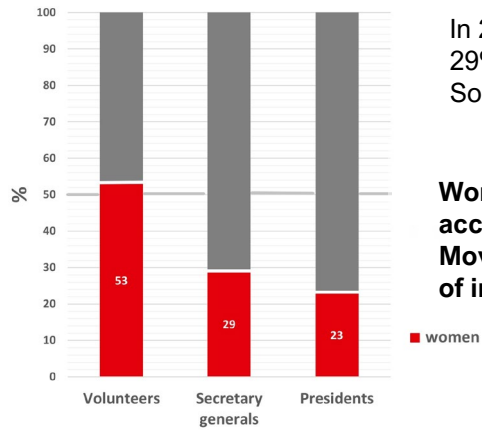


Equal Representation Matters!

In 2022, 53% of RCRC volunteers are women, still, only 29% of our Secretary generals and 23% of National Society Presidents are women. *

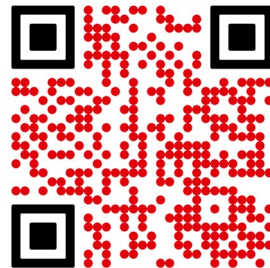

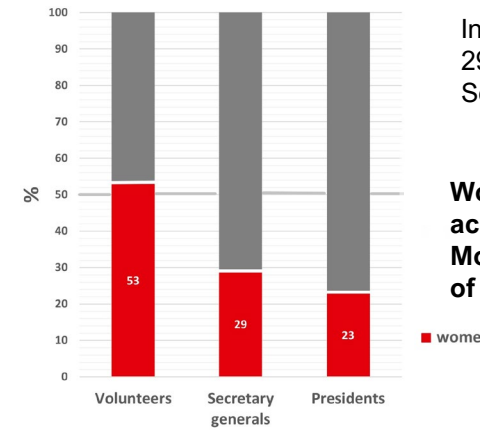
